The last preview in Aspen High began once again on a bright September day. Seventeen seniors entered school, but only fifteen stayed to continue. Two members of the class joined the navy. Alice Mikkelsen was elected class president,, Stanley Zelnick, vice-presieen president, Blenn Glenn Beck, treasurer, Beverly Caster, secretary. We started the year out enthusiastically. Mrs. Vera Vay Haskins was our sponsor. There were several changes in teachers, but we managed to carry on and receive our diplomas. Our first great event of the year was a Halloween Dance. On Easter Monday we gave a dance and raffled off an Easter Bunny. Our prom, a gala affair, was on April 23rd. Commencement exercises were on May 20th. Off we went on a wonderful sneak day. Now th doors to the hall of fame are closing , but we know that life is all the Big Passing Parade, so we simply go on to another wider and greater field of careers and futures dedicated to the task of helping to bring peace and security to our one world.
