This is the first opportunity I have ever had to write a message that looked ahead instead of back. Ordinarily, the annual comes out in the last part of the school year instead of the first part.

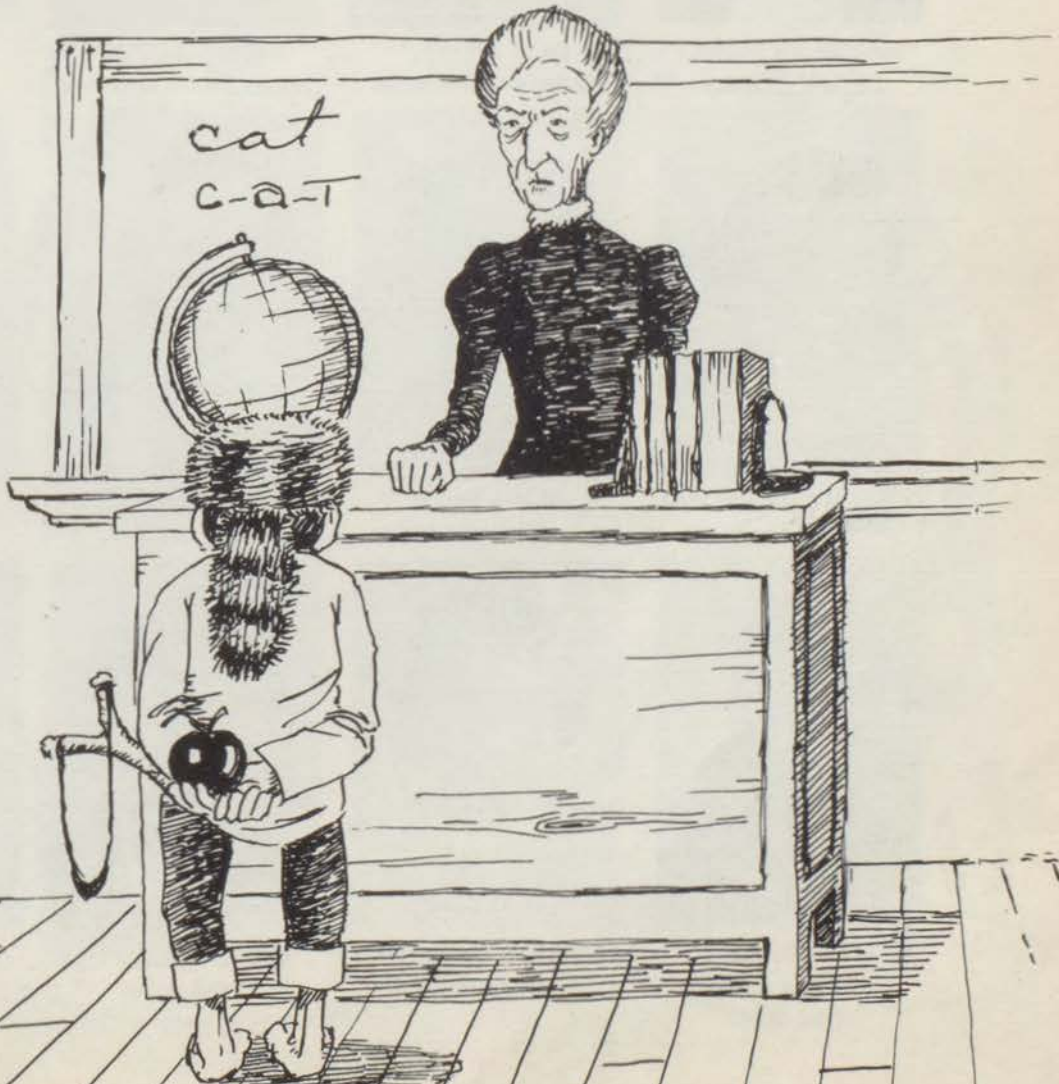

Ann Hollenbeck wills her soprano voice to Marion Clifford her fan mail and acting ability to Gloria Musso.

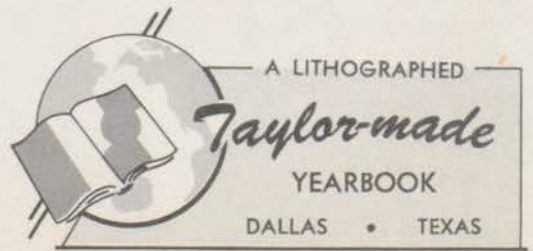
Janie McGill embarrassingly wills her southern drawl to Claude Conners, and one package of Camels to Gay Anderson or does she prefer Luckies.
