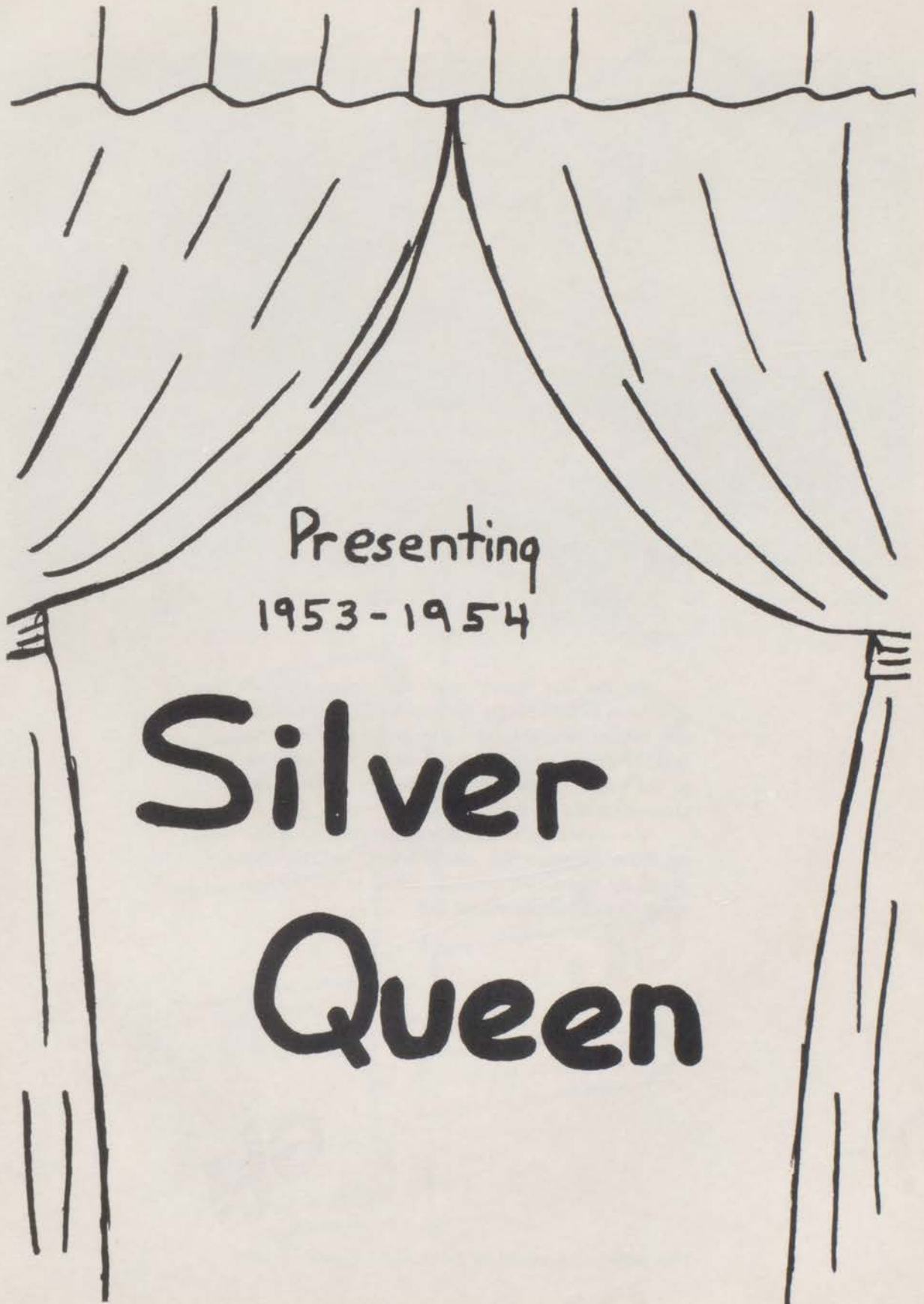

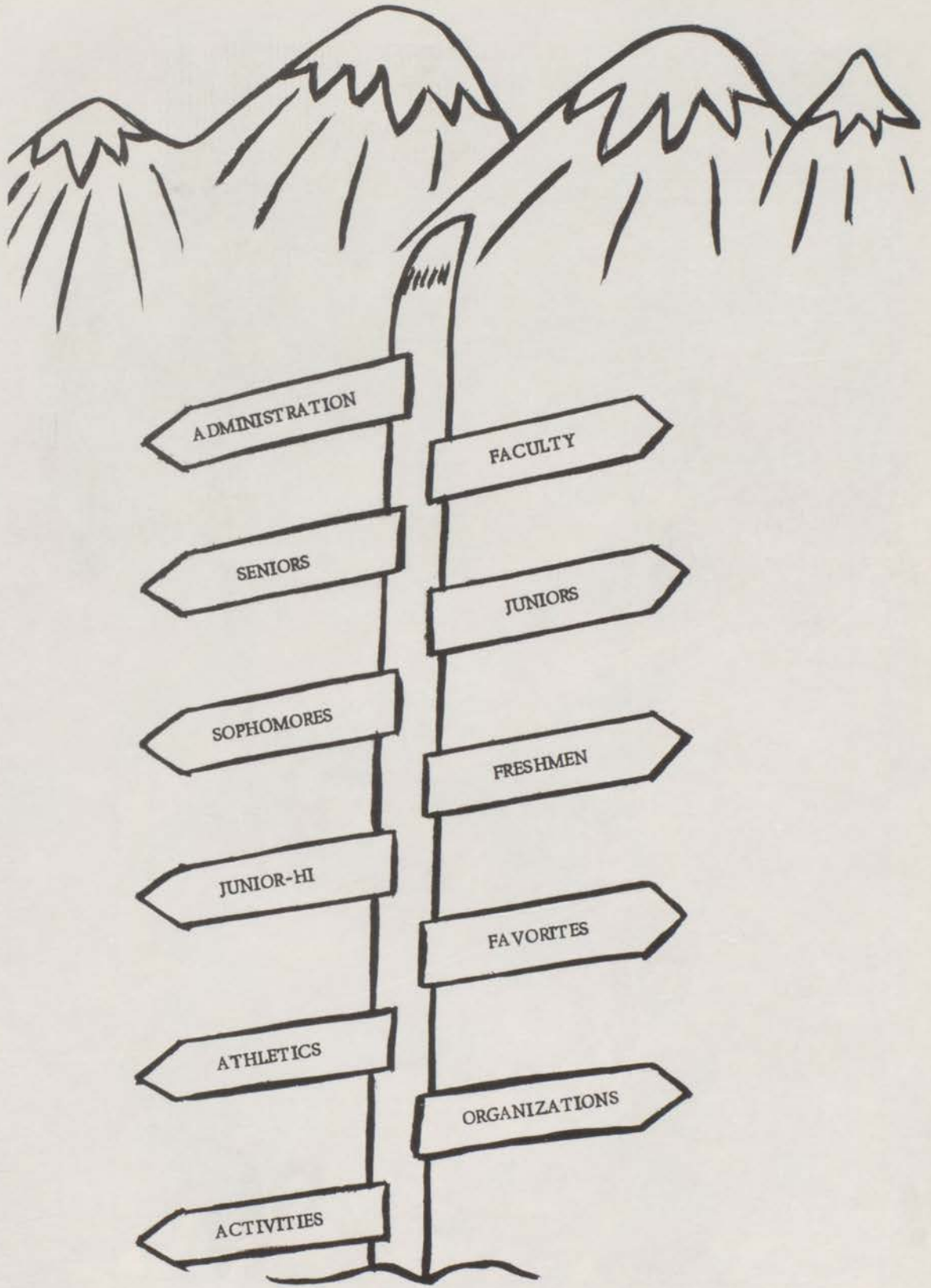

We would like to take this opportunity to thank our superintendent, the school board, and the taxpayers for these additional facilities which help so much to enliven our school day.

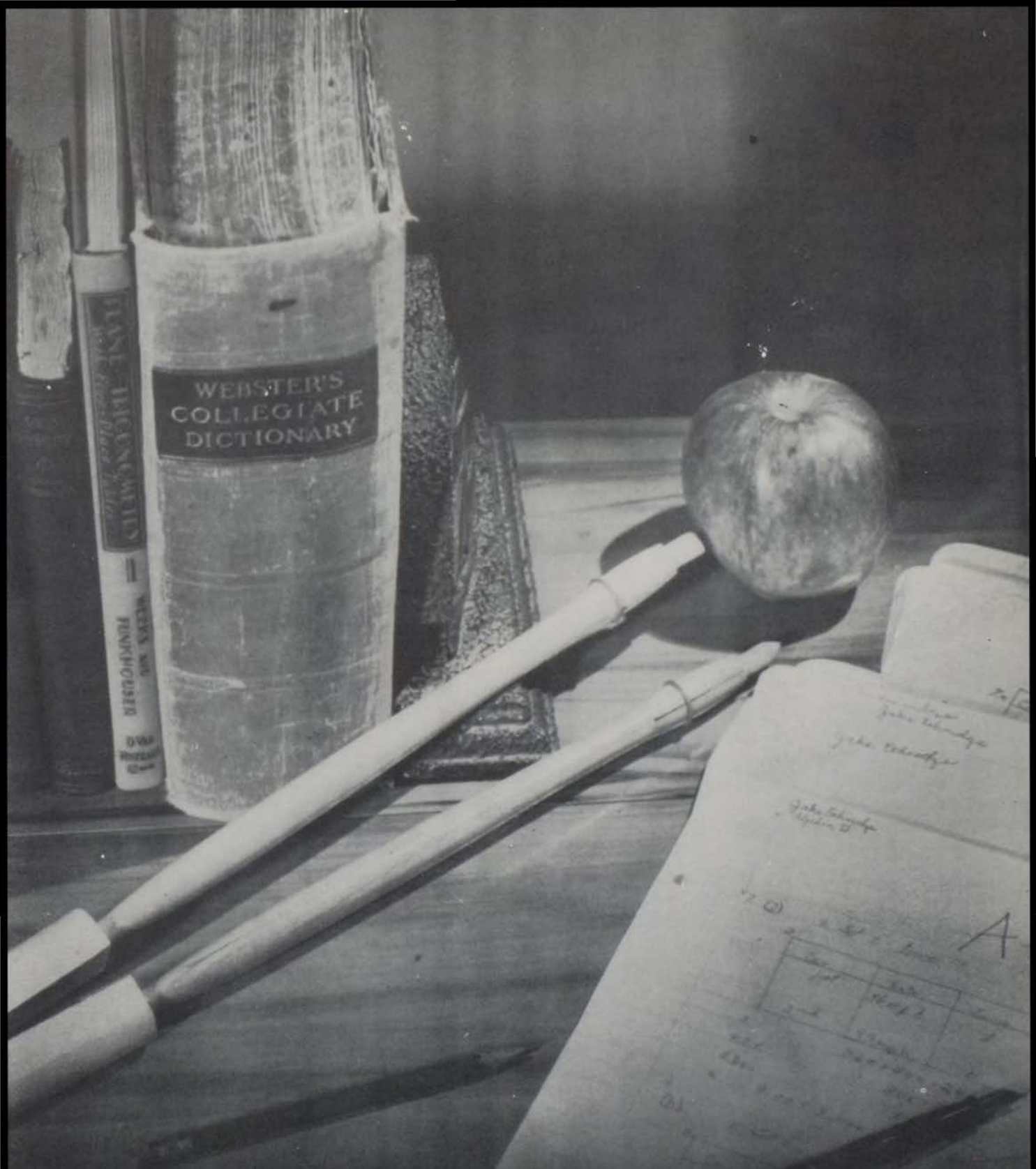
