Then they suffered a crushing defeat at the hands of Minturn. Bouncing back, they tromped Eagle soundly, and defeated league-leaders, Gypsum, 20-0, and New Castle, 6-0. It was the first time that Gypsum had been shut out in over forty consecutive games.

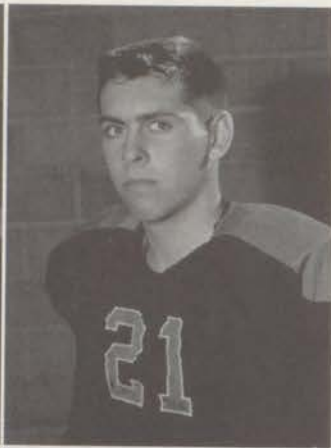
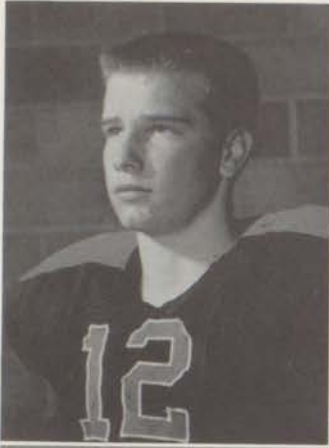
Thus the squad finished the season with a 7-2 win-loss record. A tribute must be paid to Coach Noss for his fine coaching.
