Notes from the Principal

Two primary reasons attracted me to consider the position of principal of Aspen High School. One was the small size and informal atmosphere and the other the flexible schedule. The combination of the two would seem to create a most favorable situation for learning. The small size is a rather obvious asset as it offers small classes and individual learning situations. But what about flexible scheduling? The basic purpose of flexible scheduling is the same as that of any type of schedule: allowing the student to learn in the most effective way. Flexible scheduling is simply a different approach to the use of the time spent in school.

The students at Aspen High are really the ones that can benefit from a flexible schedule. One of the benefits to be gained is that each teacher has been able to structure his individual course to best fit the needs of students. Each student is able to spend the optimum time structured into a course and then is able to work at his own rate individually. The latter part of this statement is the second real benefit and the one that offers each student a challenge.

How shall I spend the time that is not scheduled? The majority of students at Aspen High have asked this question and a majority have also answered this question by the way their time is spent. The primary objective at school is to obtain a worthwhile education. This objective must be kept in mind as each individual student pursues his daily studies. The first and most important item to take care of in un-scheduled time is academic work. Once this is done then there is still time for leisure conversation, library reading, conferences with teachers, yearbooks, or whatever extra-curricular activity a student may choose.

The challenge is also here for faculty members. It is always enjoyable and easy to work with the student who does his work on time and puts forth an effort, but what about the one who is disinterested and wastes a majority of his unscheduled time. It is often easy to allow such persons to wander and be disregarded as long as they don't cause trouble. Do educators have an obligation? Yes. A student who is not inspired to work is not only a challenge but a definite obligation.

Students and teachers at Aspen High School have both made a very favorable impression on me, and I congratulate both for a smooth opening of school. With the cooperation that has been received from both students and faculty the remainder of the year promises to be exceptional for all involved.

To the dismay of many, Aspen no longer has a small high school. The school broke the three hundred mark this week in enrollment. But with the continued cooperation of the faculty and the students, Aspen High School can remain a friendly, informal school.
