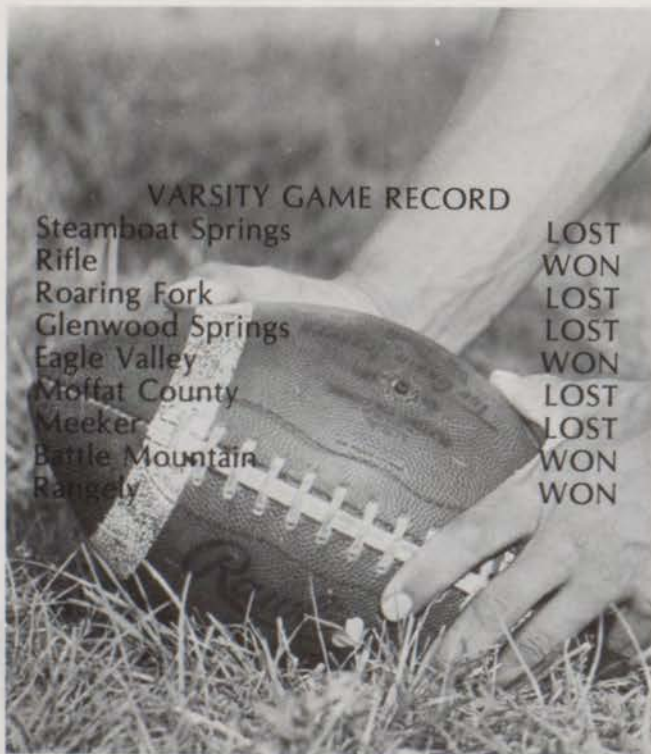
Victory Is Fleeting; Teamwork Is Enduring

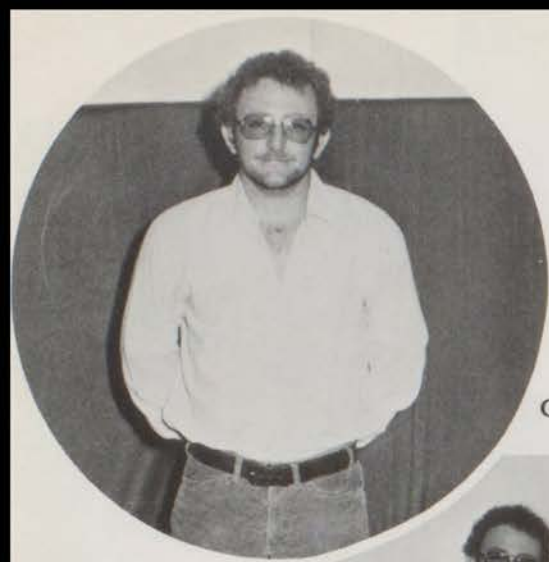

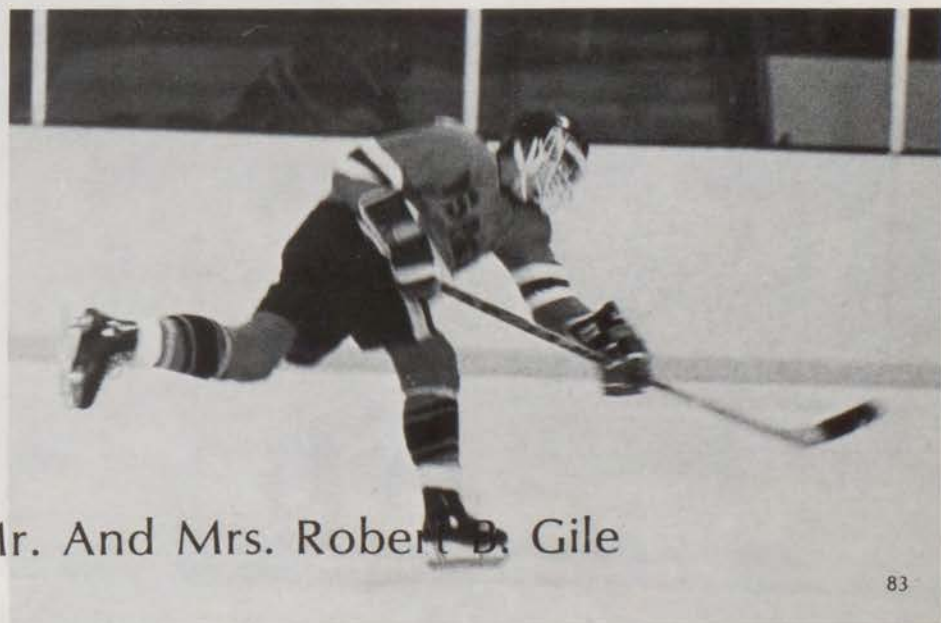
Aspen Icemen Cometh; Sticks At Ready

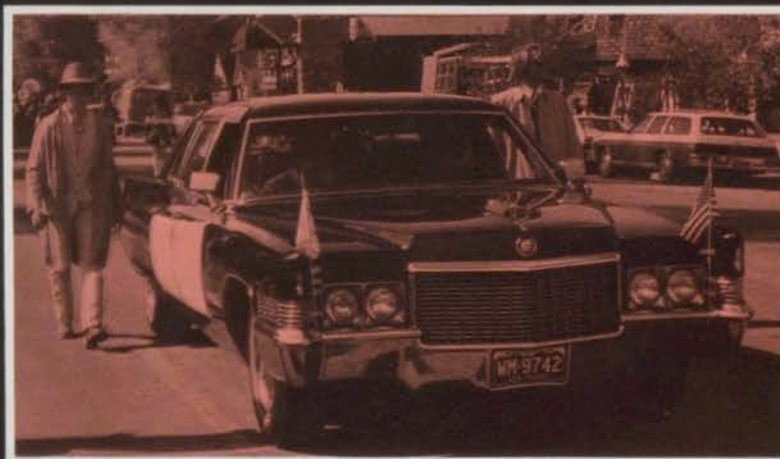
