Aspen then returned home for their last home game and split with Meeker 6-6, the Skiers finished with two wins on the road against Rangely 21-6 and Battle Mountain 25-20. Lance Clark made the all-state team, and Aspen placed four men on the all-conference team: Lance Clark, Mike Kelley, and Jeff Gerbaz on offense and Paul Popish on defense. Four Skiers also made honorable mention: Steve Fitzgerald, Paul Kienast, Terry Conner, and Ole Westerlind.
