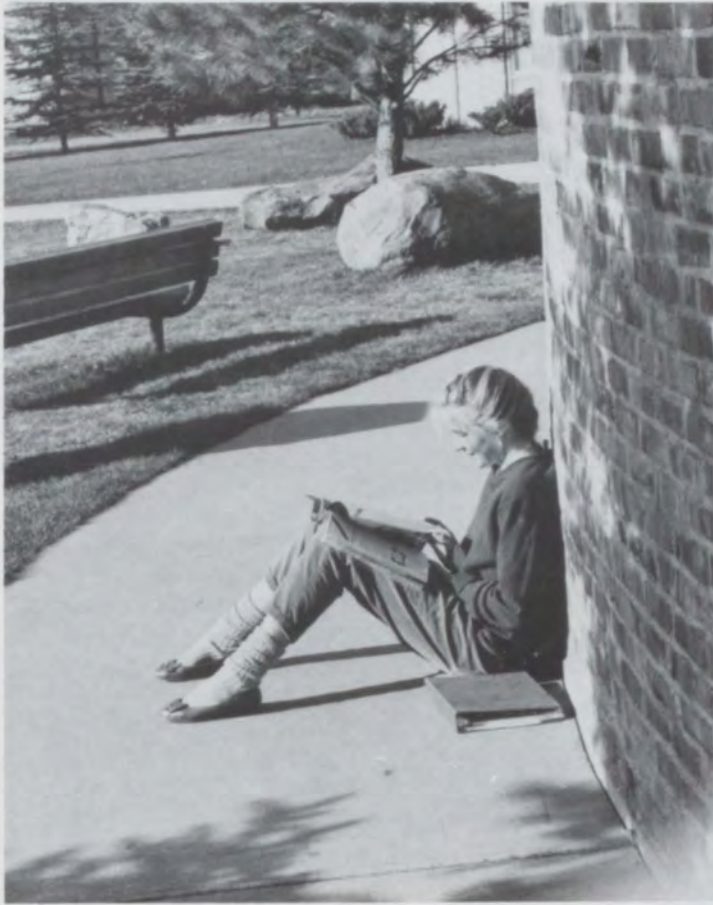












# Homecoming 1985

Homecoming '85 was a time of our lives with a lot of school spirit. We will never forget the fun, excitement, and class competition .... The Best Ever!!!

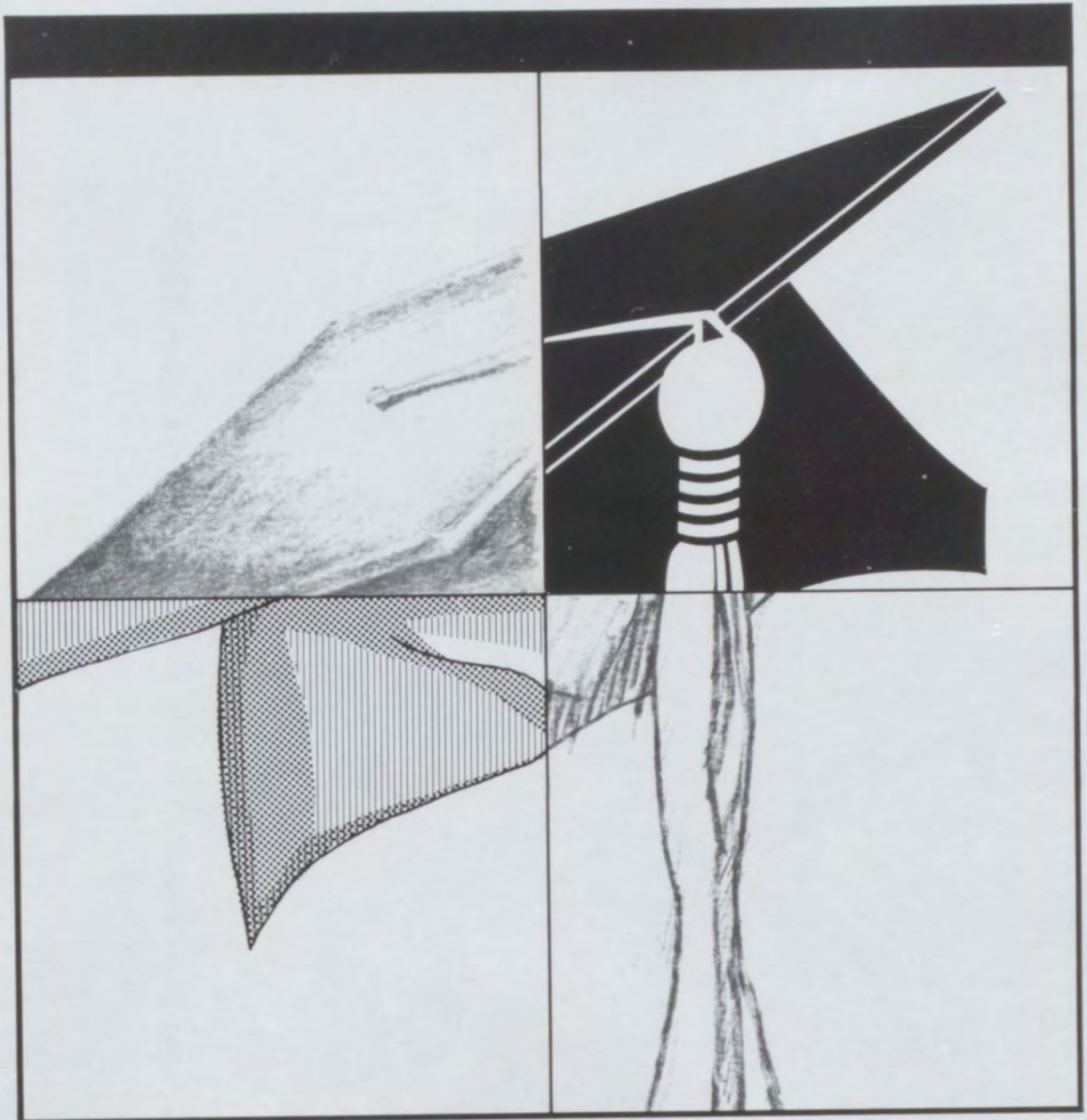
