The team won two team championships in Durango and Montrose. They came in third in Districts and missed going to State by two strokes. The State results on Damon Simpson's rounds for the State playoffs were a 79 and a 78 putting him 23rd out of 128 golfers. Eri Crum had a shaky start his first round and shot an 84, but in his second round he shot a 78 for a total of 162, which put him 44th out of 128 golfers. According to Coach Cook, Eri will most likely be in the state tournament next year and in years to come.

Coach Cook is very optimistic about next year. Even with the loss of three college-bound seniors, the return of Eri Crum, Ezra Louthis, Fitz Scott, and Matt Fields, makes an excellent nucleus for 1991.

According to Werk Cook, the Aspen High School golf coach, this year showed a great improvement in the players. The efforts of the previous two years really payed off. There was a good blend of underclassmen and seniors this year. Seniors Damon Simpson, Chris Scheer and Ryan Rudolph led the team, one of the top three teams in the very competitive Southwestern District. Among the highlights were Damon Simpson's two tournament wins in Durango (71) and Moab (75). He was also co-medalist in Districts with a 76. The Districts were played at Rifle, a very challenging course. Eri Crum had several 2nd place finishes including Durango, Montrose and Snowmass.
