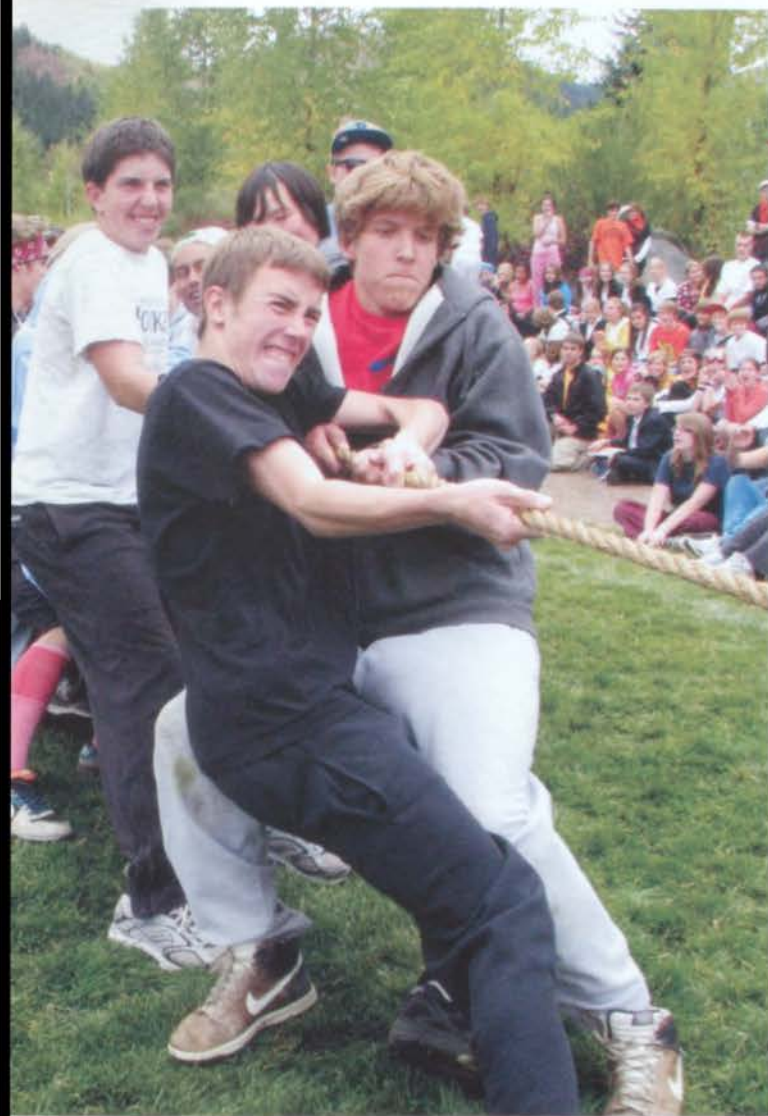

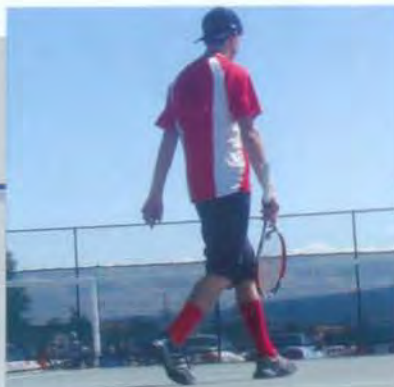

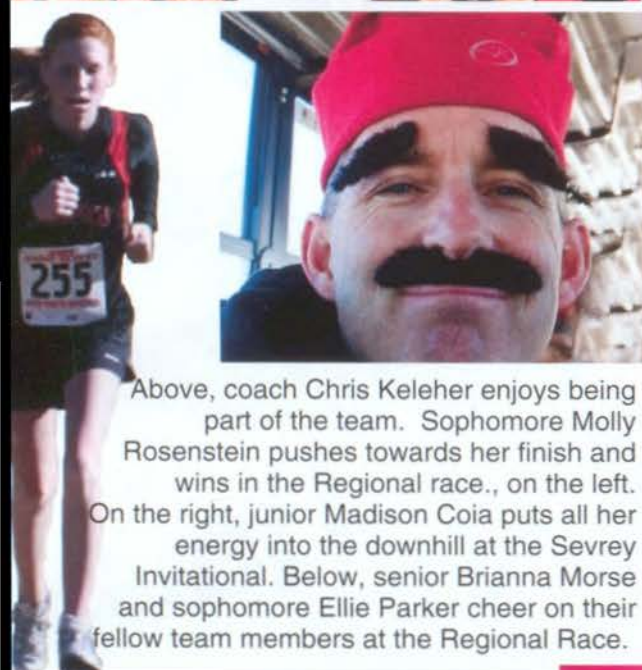
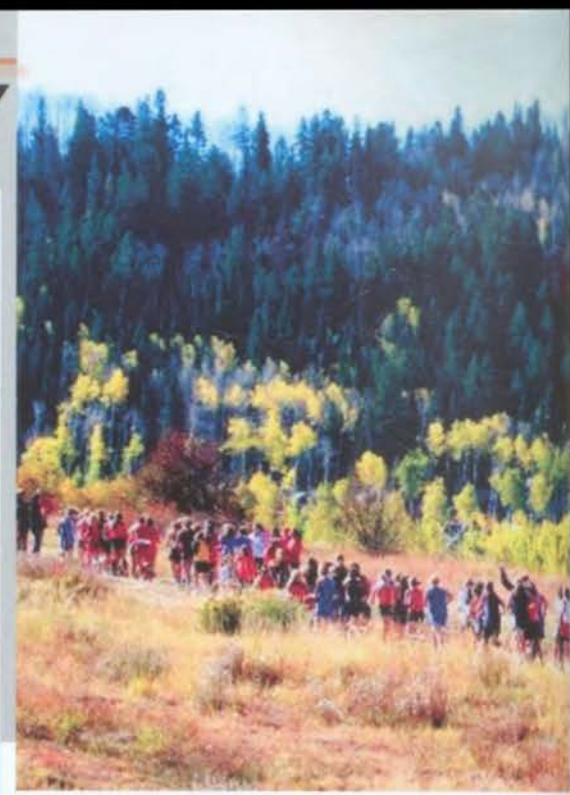

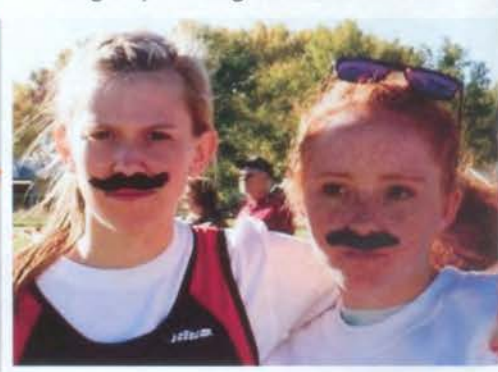

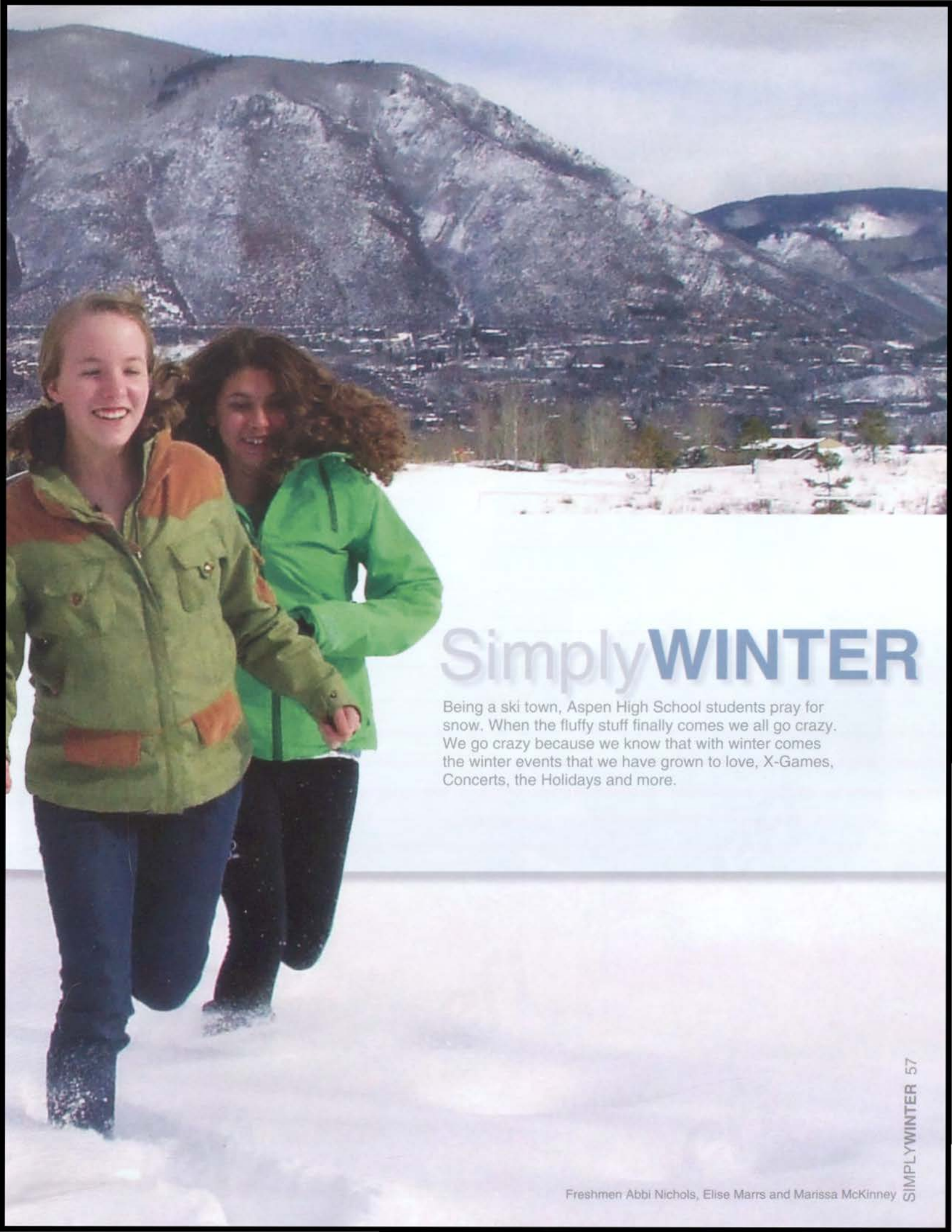

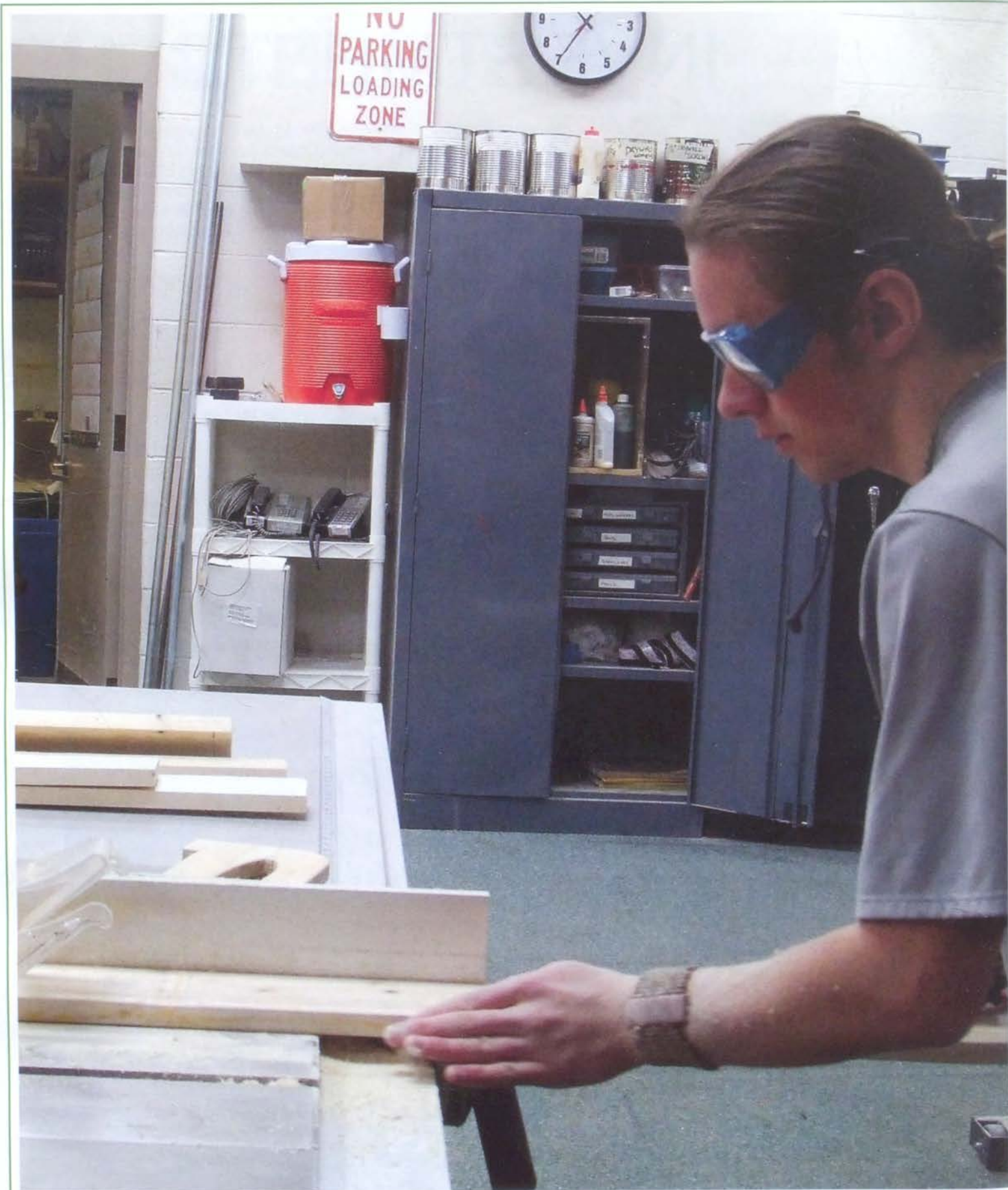
INVESTMENT CLUB

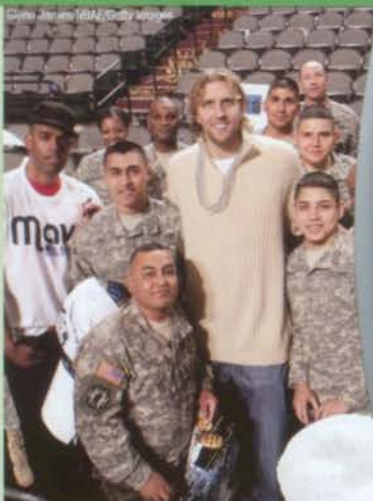

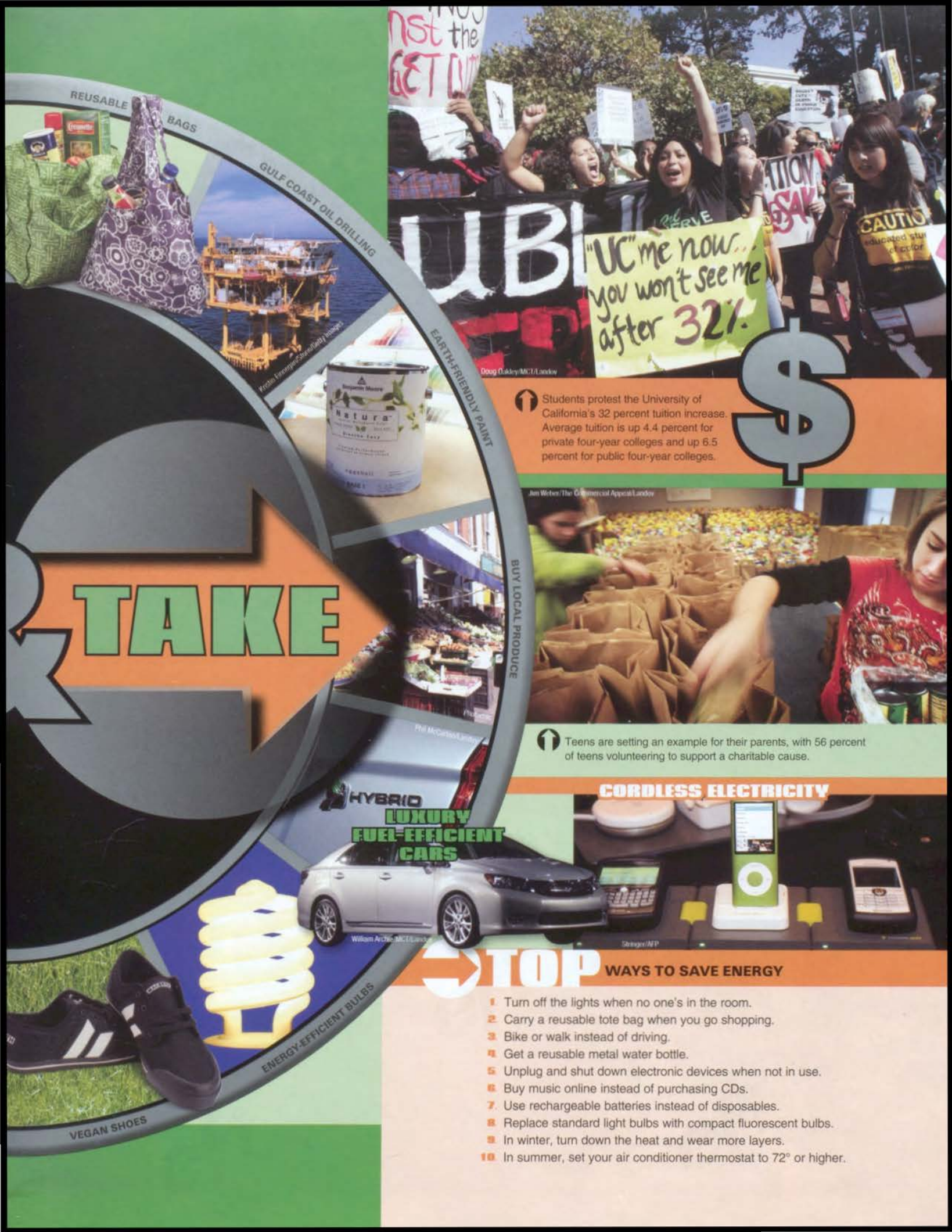
